



GUIDE TO SUBMITTING ABSTRACTS THROUGH THE CONGRESS MANAGEMENT PLATFORM

1. Before you start

Abstracts for the Congress must be submitted through a management platform.

Before starting your submission, we recommend having the following information ready:

- Abstract title and text.
- Details of authors and co-authors.
- The person who will present the work at the Congress.
- The track or tracks related to the work.
- Abstract type.
- First and second presentation format preferences.
- Three keywords.

This guide explains the procedure for submitting an abstract through the Congress management platform. Please consult the call for abstracts guidelines beforehand for full details of all requirements applicable to abstracts.

Three decades after its first edition, Barcelona will once again host the International Congress on Women, Work and Health, on 28–30 April 2027, bringing together experts from different disciplines and countries to share knowledge, experiences and new perspectives on the relationship between work, health and gender.

The Congress aims to foster dialogue between research, professional practice and public policy to advance occupational health from a sex-gender perspective: making inequalities and occupational risks visible, understanding their differential impacts, and promoting more equitable and effective prevention and public policies.

4. Add the authors and indicate who will present the work

At least one of the people listed as an author must be marked as **Speaker** using the microphone icon.

The person marked with the microphone icon will be responsible for presenting the work in person at the Congress if the proposal is accepted.

Important: if no person is marked as Speaker, the management platform will not allow the abstract submission to be completed correctly.

Introduction and objectives: Occupational heat exposure is an increasing concern for outdoor workers. This study aimed to analyse potential sex and gender differences in exposure to heat and in the preventive measures available to workers.

Methods: A cross-sectional study was conducted among 120 outdoor workers from different occupational sectors in Barcelona. Data were collected through questionnaires on working conditions, heat exposure, preventive measures and perceived health effects. Results were analysed by sex and selected gender-related working conditions.

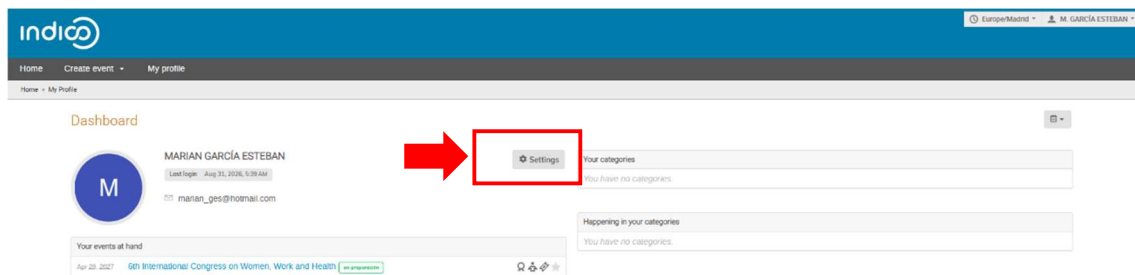

6. Complete the classification and presentation details

Tracks

All submissions must incorporate a sex-gender perspective and address its relationship with occupational health.

Keywords

References

This field is mandatory. Enter the bibliographic and/or regulatory references related to your work. You may include a **maximum of 10 references**, which must follow **Vancouver style**.

Accepted proposals will subsequently receive information on the assigned presentation mode, presentation format and duration, as well as the instructions required to participate in the Congress.
